

We had an excellent crew who worked hard and accomplished a lot for us. Luckly, we still have a few seasonal staff members that will be able to help us into the fall.

For those of you who had not heard, Arik, our Park Manager, left in June to go back to Willow River. However, I can announce that Hannah Cross will be our new Park Manager starting on August 24. 
